The Stamp Act

- When this tax law came about, the colonists were angry and confused with England.
- The colonies still thought of themselves as English, and they couldn't understand why England was "punishing" them with unnecessary taxes.
- The Stamp Act, in 1765, required <u>all</u> colonists to buy special stamps in order to read a newspaper, send a letter, sign a contract, get a license, etc.
 - Without this special stamp, all paperwork was considered illegal and not recognized.



Colonists responded to new taxes with **boycotts** (refusing to buy British goods that were taxed).


<u>boycott</u> – an organized decision to refuse to buy a product.


The Quartering Act

The boycotts were successful, but the English king (King George III) and Parliament **believed** the Americans should obey British laws and took power away from the colonies and sent more British soldiers.

The Townsend Act + <u>Boston Massacre</u>

- The Townsend Act actually led some people to their deaths!
- The Townsend Act, of 1770, involved the British soldiers being allowed to search the property of colonists for no reason at all.
- If the British soldiers saw something they thought was "suspicious", they were allowed to take it away from the colonists.
- The colonists flipped!!!! The Boston Massacre is what happened. Do you know what this event is?
